
ABOUT THE COLLEGE

It has a spacious Campus covering 268.86 bighas (89 acres) of land allotted by the State Government.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students are expected to observe good conduct in thought and action. Breaching of the following *'Rules and Regulations'* of the college shall render the students liable to disciplinary action.

- The use of alcohol and drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found using or being intoxicated shall be fined Rs. 500/- and may be liable to expulsion.
- Smoking inside the College campus is strictly forbidden. Any student found smoking in the college campus shall be fined up to Rs 200/-.
- As per the Ordinance of Mizoram University, 75% attendance is mandatory, failing which a student may be debarred from filling up of the Under Graduate Examination form.
- Irregularity in attendance, persistent idleness or negligence or indifference towards the work assigned will be liable to disciplinary action.
- Students must show respect and obedience to the staffs of the College. Misconduct
 and misbehaviour of any kind towards a teacher or employee of the College or
 another institution or any visitor to the college or another institution will be seriously
 dealt with.
- Students automatically become members of the Students' Union which functions under the direction and supervision of the college authority.
- Causing disturbance to a class or the office or the library or sports (indoor or outdoor) is strictly prohibited.
- It is forbidden to show misconduct or misbehaviour of any kind at the time of election to the students' bodies or at meeting or during curricular or extra-curricular activities.
- Causing damage to furniture or any other property of the College will be seriously dealt with.
- Eve-teasing and ragging in any form is prohibited.
- Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid is forbidden.



FACILITIES OFFERED

- Academic Building with ICT enabled Classrooms: It provides spacious classrooms which foster opportunities for technology enhanced teaching and learning.
- Library: The college library is semi-automated, is well-designed and airy. Today, it boasts of stocking over 9000 books and periodicals. Students can also access e-journals and e-book through NLIST subscriptions available in the library.
- Auditorium: The college has two auditoriums located in the top floor of Academic Block-A and Block-B with more than 100 seating capacity is convenient for organizing seminars, cultural programmes, conferences, trainings etc.
- Students' Common Room: A spacious common room is available for the students where they can socialize and relax during their leisure time with indoor game facilities.
- Language Lab: Language Lab. helps to enhance the communication skills of students by improving their listening and speaking skills through the help of audio-visual lessons. It is looked after by the English department.
- GIS & Cartography Lab: The GIS and Cartography Lab. provides cartographic and GIS services to the students of Geography department. The Lab. is established to provide instruction in the areas of remote sensing, geospatial information system and image processing. The room is also equipped with several cartographic and surveying instruments.
- Entrepreneurship Knowledge Cell (EKC): The Entrepreneurship Knowledge Cell has been sponsored and set up under EDC-MEDMOC, to develop, enable and build-up the entrepreneurial culture amongst the students.



- Cafeteria: The college canteen provided refreshment services to the students and staffs of the college. Matters related to the canteen is taken care of by the Canteen Committee of the college.
- Gymnasium: To maintain the health and fitness of the students, a well-equipped gymnasium at the college campus provided facility for indoor physical workout.
- Indoor Stadium: Indoor stadium is located within the campus where students and staff of the college can play badminton and table tennis.
- NIELIT Study Centre: NIELIT has its branch in the college. Students can join certificate course on computer concept (CCC) and other programmes.
- IGNOU Study Centre: The IGNOU Study Centre offers a variety of courses in which students can pursue Under Graduate and Post Graduate studies.
- **Bus:** Bus is provided to the students since the college is located away from the town.
- **Girls' Hostel** which has a capacity of 10 seats with warden residence.
- **Boys' Hostel** which has a capacity of 17 seats with warden residence.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

* National Service Scheme (NSS)

Under the active supervision of the Programme Officers, the NSS volunteers (students) provide opportunities for students to take part in various useful activities. This enables the students to develop their overall personality through community service.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC Unit of the college has been actively functioning since 2021 under the supervision of two Care Taker Officers. The enrolment capacity for both the senior division and the senior wing is 100 cadets. Members of the NCC attended the Combined Annual Training Camp and participated at the ceremonial function of Republic Day and Independence Day

Evangelical Union (EU)

The College has an *Evangelical Union* to carry out the vision of the Union Evangelical Students of India (UESI).

Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

To prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS among the youths, the Red Ribbon Club plays a very important role in combating this issue. The Red Ribbon Club makes use of Peer Educators for disseminating awareness among the students.

Youth Adventure Club (YAC)

The club aims to promote the spirit of adventure and the joy of encounter with nature to the students. Members of the club build friendships and exercise teams skills by planning and participating in outdoor adventures, such as rock climbing, hiking, rafting, para-gliding etc.

Eco-Club

Eco-Club was established to 'work for the preservation of environment. Membership to this Club is opened to all the staff and students of this college, by paying a membership fee, which will be determined by the Executive Committee from time to time.

Literature Club

Established in 2023, Literature Club is actively involving in the promotion of literature among the students. The club has set up and maintained Little Library near Ropuiliani Hall.



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Students seeking admission to the college should apply in prescribed application form available from the college office on payment of Rs. 100/- within the notified period with following enclosures:

- i. Attested copy of Certificate and mark sheet of HSSLC or equivalent.
- ii. Two copies of recent passport size photograph.
- iii. Original copies of mark sheet and certificate should be produced at the time of admission.

Registration

A student must register his/her name under Mizoram University before the First Semester Examination.

Migration

A student migrating from other University/ Board and seeking admission in this College shall have to submit Migration Certificate issued by the University/ Board last studied. However, students who have passed under Mizoram Board of School Education need not to submit the same.

DEFINITIONS

- Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year. The Under Graduate Programme shall consist of three academic years (with optional fourth year) with two semesters in each year.
- **Programme:** An educational programme leading to award of under graduate degree.
- Semester: Each semester will consists of 18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester is scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.
- Course: Usually referred to, as 'papers' is a component of a programme. The course should define learning objective and learning outcomes. A course is designed to comprise lectures/ tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/ project work/viva/ seminars/ assignment/ presentation etc. or a combination of some of these.
- Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit shall mean one hour of teaching (lecture of tutorial) or two hours of laboratory/practical work per week in a semester of 18 weeks.
- Letter Grade: It is an index of performance of learners in a said course. Grades are denoted by O, A+, A, B+, B, C and F
- **Grade Point**: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- **Credit Point:** It is product a grade point and number of credits for a course.
- Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is a ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.



CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES (CCFUGP) 2022

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUGP)" incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

The new student-centric CCFUGP of UGC introduces holistic and multidisciplinary undergraduate education that would help develop all capacities of human beings – intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, ethical, and moral – in an integrated manner; soft skills, such as complex problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, communication skills; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field(s) of learning.

The UG curriculum consists of the following components:

i. Major Stream Courses

These are the disciplines or subjects of main focus which provide the opportunity for students to pursue in-depth study of a particular discipline or subject and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure at least 50% of the total credits in the major discipline. All major courses will be of 4 credits each.

ii. Minor Stream Courses

Minor courses help the students to gain broader understanding beyond the major disciplines. Students will have the option to choose other disciplinary/interdisciplinary course and skill-based courses relating to a chosen vocational education programme as minor. Students who take prescribed number of courses in a discipline or interdisciplinary area of study other than the chosen major will qualify for a minor in that discipline or the chosen interdisciplinary area of study. All minor courses will also be of 4 credits each.



iii. Multi-disciplinary Courses

All students are required to undergo three introductory-level courses relating to any of the following broad disciplines. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose courses already taken at higher secondary level in the proposed major and minor stream under this category. All courses under multidisciplinary will be of 3 credits each.

iv. Ability Enhancement Courses (Language and Communication Skill Courses)

Students are required to achieve competency in Modern Indian Language (MIL) and in English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills. The courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills, that help students articulate their arguments and present their thinking clearly and coherently and recognize the importance of language as a mediator of knowledge and identity. They would also enable students to acquaint themselves with eh cultural and intellectual heritage of the chosen MIL and English language, as well as to provide a reflective understanding of the structure and complexity of the language/literature related to both the MIL and English language. The courses under this category will be assigned 3 credits.

v. Skill Enhancement Courses

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. Courses will be designed as per students' needs and available institutional resources. Each of the Skill Enhancement courses will be assigned 3 credits.

vi. Value Added Courses

These are courses common to all UG students. All UG students are required to take the following courses under the category of value-added courses. Each course under this category will be of 2 credits.



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- Universal Human Values: This introductory level course aims at helping the students to become more aware of themselves and their surroundings (family, society and nature. The course is also expected to help the students to become more responsible in life, and in handling problems with sustainable solutions while keeping human relationships and human nature in mind.
- Understanding India: The course aims at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the knowledge and understanding of contemporary India with its historical perspective, the basic framework of the goals and policies of national development, and the constitutional obligations with special emphasis on constitutional values and fundamental rights and duties.
- Environmental Science / Education: The course seeks to equip students with the ability to apply the acquired knowledge, skills attitudes, and values required to take appropriate actions for mitigating the effects of environmental degradation, climate change, and pollution, effective waste management, conservation of biological diversity, management of biological resources, forest and wildlife conservation, and sustainable development and living.
- Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness: Course components relating to health and wellness seek to promote an optimal state of physical, emotional, intellectual, social, spiritual, and environmental well-being of a person. Sports and fitness activities will be organised outside the regular institutional working hours. Yoga education would focus on preparing the students physically and mentally for the integration of their physical, mental, and spiritual faculties, and equipping them with basic knowledge about one's personality, maintaining self-discipline and self-control, to learn to handle oneself well in all life situations. The focus of sports and fitness components of the courses will be on the improvement of physical fitness including the improvement of various components of physical and skills-related fitness like strength, speed, coordination, endurance, and flexibility; acquisition of sports skills including motor skills as well as basic movement skills relevant to a particular sport; improvement of tactical abilities; and improvement of mental abilities.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATION

- The University will conduct all End-Semester Examinations.
- Each course shall be evaluated at the scale of 100 for all courses, irrespective of theory and practical. There shall be continuous assessment carrying 25 marks and an End-Semester Examination carrying 75 marks.
- Students cannot repeat a course for Internal Assessment Component (Internal Exams and Assignment).
- Students will be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration of completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

Eligibility for Examination

Student who attends 75% of the total class taken in each of the papers shall be eligible for filling up of examination form and appear the end semester examination.

Classification of Successful Candidates

- Student shall be declared pass if he/she obtains a minimum of 40% of maximum marks separately in the internal assessment and end semester examinations.
- The marks obtained by a candidate in all six semesters shall be taken into account while declaring the results.
- Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of marks obtained in each semester.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of grades obtained in all the semesters.
- Grade card, based on the grades earned, shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester along with SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) of that semester and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) earned till that Semester.



EXAMINATION AND ASSESSMENT

Each course, shall be evaluated at the scale of 100. For all courses, irrespective of theory and practical, there shall be continuous internal assessment carrying 25 marks and an end-semester examination carrying 75 marks.

1. Continuous Assessment:

Assessment of sessional work shall be carried out by way of i) class test, ii) assignments, seminar, project, presentation etc., and iii) attendance. There will be two compulsory class tests. If student appears for only one test, average will be computed from the marks obtained in the test he/she appears.

3. Grading

- Each course (paper) shall be grade on the basis of marks obtained (on scaled marks of 100) during a semester.
- Letter Grades and Grade Points: There shall be absolute grading where marks obtained (out of 100) by a student in a course is converted to a Grade on a 10-point scale as given below:

4. Repeating or Options for Other Courses

- If a student fails in a particular course, he/she may repeat the same course in any semester.
- Repetition of course(s) shall be only for end-semester examinations.
- In lieu of the failed courses, student may opt for the following in consultation with parent department:
 - Choose other course(s) having same credits.
 - Choose online courses approved by Mizoram University as per existing UGC regulations having same credits.

5. Re-evaluation

- In case student is not satisfied with the marks obtained he/she shall submit application for re-evaluation using prescribed form to the Controller of Examinations within 15 days from the date of declaration of results.
- Re-evaluation is permissible only for end-semester examination.
- The marks awarded in the re-evaluation shall be final.

6. Promotion

• For moving from First Year to Second Year, Second to Third and Third to Fourth Year, a student needs to clear at least 50% of the course in each academic session.

7. Ranking

Programme / Subject wise ranking shall be done for the award of Gold Medal from students of 3 Year UG Programmes and 4 Year UG Programmes in the following manner:

- Only those students who pass all the courses in regular chance with CGPA of 7.00 and above will be eligible for ranking.
- If two or more candidates secure same CGPA, the candidate having higher SGPA in 5th & 6th semesters (for students exiting after completion of 3 Year UG Programmes) and 7th & 8th semesters (for students of 4 Year UG Programmes) shall be considered.





1. Academic Excellence Award

Awarded to University Gold Medalist at BA (Honours) and BA (Honours with Research)

Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs. 1,00,000

2. Academic Proficiency Award

Awarded to rank holders in the final examination.

- i. Subject Topper: Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs, 70,000
- ii. 2nd Position Holder: Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs, 60,000
- iii. 3rd Position Holder: Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs, 50,000
- iv. 4th to 10th Position Holders: Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs, 40,000

3. Valedictorian

Awarded to student with the highest CGPA irrespective of the departments. *Certificate + Monetary Award*

4. Departmental Academic Proficiency Award

Awarded to students with the highest CGPA in their respective department. *Certificate + Monetary Award of Rs. 2,000*

5. Student of the Year

Awarded to students with good academic records and attendance, active participation in co-curricular activities and having no academic misconduct.

6. Best Library User Award

Awarded to students based on the frequency of their visit to the library according to attendance register, utilization of library resources and facilities.


